Dear 4-H Goat Leaders and Members:

The 4-H/FFA Breeding Goat Show at Troy Fair will be held on Friday, July 31 starting at 9:00 A.M. in the Sheep Barn. Entry forms have been included-they are due at the Extension Office on June 1, 2020.

Penn State Ethics and Quality Assurance Training:

All 4-Hers enrolled in animal projects will be required to attend a training and fill out a survey by July 1. See your leader for options and available trainings.

Project books will be due on Saturday, July 18 before 2:00 p.m. or Friday, July 17 by noon at the Extension Office if you are NOT doing an interview.

You will need to complete the Breeding Livestock and/or Livestock Record Book. A project poster and oral Presentation to the club. QAM certificate attached.

Youth must also complete an Activity Report and a Story. This story should include information on experiences with the 4-H animal project, what was learned from completing the records, experiences gained from being involved in the 4-H Club, etc.

If your books are not turned in on time, you will not be eligible to show your project at 4-H Roundup.

If you want to know how you will be judged there are score sheets at the Extension Office and your leader will also have these score sheets.

You must receive at least a white ribbon on your project book in order to show.

* Note, missing whole sections counts as a zero and costs you all the points for that section.

Your 4-H/FFA youth Goat Show entries have been included. They also are available on the Bradford County Cooperative Extension Website in the 4-H and Youth Section under Member Resources.

Arrival Time

Goats need to arrive by 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 30. All goats must be checked for signs of disease before they can unload.

Check Out

Animals will need to stay until 6:00 p.m. on Friday, July 31.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to clean all their pens before leaving the fairgrounds. Any Exhibitor who does not clean out their pen(s) will be charged a \$20 fee or risk forfeiting their right to show in following years.

Ownership

All goats must be owned by the exhibitor by June 1, 2020.

Entry Deadline

Entries are due at the Extension office by June 1, 2020. **Limit of 10 goats per exhibitor**

Bedding, Hay and Feed –All bedding, hay and other feed is to be furnished by the exhibitor. Exhibitors are responsible for the removal of manure and bedding from the barns to a central collection point. Wheelbarrows are suggested – bring your own or share. A fee will be charged if not properly cleaned out.

Show Dress:

Showing a Market or Meat Breeding Goat:

- Black jeans or pants with a white collard or button-down shirt, club or farm collard shirts are acceptable.
- Clean boots or closed toe shoes.

Showing a Dairy Goat

- White jeans or pants with a white collard or button-down shirt, club or farm collard shirts are acceptable.
- Clean boots or closed toe shoes

If you choose not to dress in the recommended fashion it may be detrimental to your placing in showmanship classes. Please contact us with any questions on this matter.

Health Requirements

Section 11: Pennsylvania Goats

Requirements:

- 1. Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:
 - a. A USDA ear tag with a US shield; or
 - b. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. scrapie tattoo (flock ID in the right ear--state postal code and letters/numbers--and individual animal ID in the left ear); or
 - c. A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.
- 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2020.
- 3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.

Section 12: Out of State Goats Requirements:

- 1. Federal regulations (USDA) require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.
- 2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) statement: This applies to states that experienced a VS outbreak in the last 12 months. In these cases an accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."
- 3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.
- 4. Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes: ;
 - a. A USDA ear tag with a US shield or
 - b. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. scrapie tattoo (flock ID in the right ear--state postal code and letters/numbers--and individual animal ID in the left ear); or
 - c. A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.
- 5. Tuberculosis testing requirements:
 - a. No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited-free by the USDA.
 - b. All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).
 - c. All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older have tested negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation; and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported have also tested negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).
