



Dear 4-H/FFA Beef Exhibitor:

The 4-H/FFA breeding beef show will be held on Monday, July 22 at the conclusion of the 4-H /FFA Market Beef Show. An entry form is included. Entries are due at the Extension Office by June 1, 2019.

4-H Breeding Beef Rules:

1. Animals must arrive either **Saturday, July 20 from 10:00A.M. to 3:00 P.M** or on **Sunday, July 21 from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.**
2. Calves must be shown according to their birth dates.
3. Exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per class.
4. Where class size is 2 or less, breeds will be combined wherever possible.
5. Animals may leave at the conclusion of the show.
6. Breeding beef must be owned or leased by the exhibitor by May 15, 2019.

4-H LIVESTOCK PROJECT REQUIREMENTS:

Check with your 4-H leader to be sure you know exactly what you need to do to complete your 4-H project. Each leader has a book which contains the requirements to complete each 4-H project. You must receive at least a white ribbon on your project in order to show.

All completed projects are due at the Fairgrounds on Saturday, July 13 by 2:00pm if you plan to interview at Round- up. If you do not plan to interview books are due in the Extension Office on Thursday, July 11 at 5 p.m. If your books are not turned in on time, you will not be eligible to show your project at 4-H Roundup.

If you want to know how you will be judged there are score sheets in the 4-H room at the Extension Office and your leader will also have these score sheets.

****Also note to be eligible for Grand Champion Project books you will need to conduct an interview on July 13 at 4-H Roundup or schedule an alternate interview by calling the Extension Office.**

Penn State Ethics and Quality Assurance Training:

Ethics and quality assurance training is required by all 4-H animal project members. Any youth that has not taken the training will not be allowed to show. The Training is to be completed by July 1, 2019 and the certificate must be included in ALL of your 4-H animal project books.

General Rules:

1. 4-H members must feed, water, and clean up for their animals during their entire stay at the Fairgrounds. If your animal is neglected, *you will not be allowed to show next year*.
2. 4-H members must clean out their stalls after their animal has left the Fairgrounds and remove all bedding to the manure pit.
3. At both the show and sale, all 4-H and FFA livestock youth must wear long dark colored pants, with closed toe and heel shoes, a navy blue, white or forest green collared shirt. There will be no shorts or tee shirts with lettering. A white shirt and black pants are recommended for both the show and sale. The buyers are business people-they want to see you at your best.
4. At NO time while in the youth are in the pens with their swine, sheep, goats or cattle are you allowed to have opened toed shoes. This includes the adults!
5. Only Sheep and Goats will be allowed to use the back of the wash rack on Monday, July 22th until 2pm.

Health Requirements

Section 3: Pennsylvania Cattle

Requirements:

1. Cattle shall be identified by an official ear tag or other unique identification device approved by PDA. Official identification includes:
 - A USDA-issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) ear tag having a US shield ; or
 - A 15 digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with “840” and having a US shield ; or
 - Other identification approved by the PDA (brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).

Recommendations:

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2019.
2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a

statement of this should be written on the CVI.

3. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older (observe appropriate slaughter withdraw time).

4. Rodeo: It is recommended that rodeo cattle of all ages be negative on an official tuberculin test within 60 days prior to the start of the fair unless they are members of and originate from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd. The cattle can be accompanied by the negative test report or the tuberculosis test results can be recorded by the veterinarian on a CVI.

Section 4: Out of State Cattle

Requirements:

1. Federal regulations (USDA) require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.

2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): This applies to cattle entering Pennsylvania from states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months. In these cases an accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals have neither been exposed to VS nor were located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."

3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

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4. Federal regulation (USDA) requires individual official animal identification. Official ID will have a US shield and includes:

- A USDA-issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag; or
- A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840"; or
- Other official identification approved by USDA. (brands and breed registrations

with tattoos are not acceptable).

5. Tuberculosis testing requirements:

No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited free by the USDA.

All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and dates of tests must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).

All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited by the USDA must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older are test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported are also test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test

report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

Special Tuberculosis Test requirement for Rodeo Cattle

All rodeo cattle and bison from out of state must be negative on an official tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to entering Pennsylvania unless they originate from and are members of an Accredited Tuberculosis-free herd within an accredited Tuberculosis-free state or zone. This requirement for rodeo cattle from out of state is in addition to all other requirements listed above for out of state cattle.

Recommendations:

1. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older (observe appropriate slaughter withdraw_time).
