LIVESTOCK TRAILER ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURES

1. **ALL LIVESTOCK MUST BE CHECKED-IN PRIOR TO UNLOADING**
2. **All trucks must enter through Gate 3, at the north end of the fairgrounds near Cummings Lumber. Gate 1, on the south end, will be used only as an exit for cattle trucks and trailers.**
3. **To reduce traffic congestion, the following rule has been implemented: Due to parking lot constraints at the Troy Fairgrounds, owners of cattle trailers who plan to park trailers for any period of time will be required to park trailers in one of the following designated parking areas:**
 - a. **Columbia Cross Roads Equipment- Route 14 Columbia Cross Rds., PA**
 - b. **Jim Jenkins Farm - Austinville Rd., Columbia Cross Rds., PA**
 - c. **Any other arrangements will be in consultation with Matt Watson 570-529-0108**
4. **Checkout time for Saturday's show will be as follows:**
 - a. **Milk cows will be released following the conclusion of the show and heifers will be released at 8PM**
5. **Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning out their own packs at the completion of each show. This includes the front feed-storage area. BALES MUST BE REMOVED-DO NOT THROW THEM IN THE MANURE PIT.**

General Rules

Every Exhibit accepted for premiums must be given an ENTRY TAG which must be PROPERLY MARKED to SHOW THE NAME OF THE EXHIBIT. In the case of livestock, BREED NAME MUST BE SHOWN on cards large enough so that the BREED NAME CAN BE READILY IDENTIFIED BY THE VIEWERS.

If the livestock is grouped together according to breed, one large sign to designate the group will be satisfactory. The ribbons or rosettes must be placed on the stall or pen of the individual winners for the duration of the fair or show. In the case of poultry, ENTRY TAGS SHOWING SPECIES must be plainly exhibited on each cage, and winning stickers must appear on such entry tags showing the winner. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in forfeiture of premiums. It will be the duty of the fair or show officials to enforce this regulation.

1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Troy Fair.
2. The fair management reserves the right to amend or add to these guidelines as its judgment may determine.
3. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibitors on display from all injury and damage but the fair is not, in any way, to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft, or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
4. Entries will be made according to classification.
5. Premiums, as listed may be given for meritorious exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. The judges may, at their discretion, award a ribbon or rosette.

The fair reserves the RIGHT TO DETERMINE how many entries they will accept from an exhibitor in the same class or, in the case of livestock, the same breed, and poultry, the same species.

THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES SHALL BE FINAL IN ALL CASES except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion - not discovered at the time of the award—is proved. In such cases, the superintendent, manager, or secretary of the fair or show, or such referee as he may appoint, may make the decision. The case may be appealed to the Fair Management or Show Commission from whose decision there can be no appeal. It is suggested that each fair have a committee of three board members designated prior to fair time for this purpose.

All protests regarding the judging must be made in writing and must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal. Such protests must be filed at the fair offices within 24 hours of the occurrence.

6. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor TO PROPERLY NAME THE ARTICLE OR BREED OF LIVESTOCK he is entering. Any exhibit improperly entered will be disqualified to receive a premium, but the judges will make the correct name on the entry tag for the benefit of the owner so the same mistake in entering need not be made the second time.
7. All entries must have been grown, produced, or made since the last fair by the person whose name appears on the tag as exhibitor. Any exhibitor may be required to prove ability to reproduce entry in any department in the presence of a qualified person.
8. Superintendents reserve the right to bar from competition any entry of inferior quality and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition. The fair reserves the right to remove any exhibit not worthy of viewing by the public.
9. Food products cannot be treated with any substance that causes them to become poisonous and unfit to be used for consumption. Any such incidents must be reported to the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair Program for further review.
10. No exhibits may be removed at any time before the close of the fair except by consent of the management of the fair.
11. Where award ribbons are stolen or destroyed, the exhibitor may receive a duplicate at the close of the fair or show which shall be supplied by the fair free of charge.
12. Any exhibitor interfering with the judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which he would otherwise have been entitled. Department superintendents may enter exhibits in their own departments, but neither they nor any other exhibitor may communicate with the judges during the time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the judges.
13. All livestock offered for premiums must have been the property of the owners for thirty (30) days or longer. Health papers are to be issued in the name of the exhibitor.
14. The market animals should be weighed on the same set of scales under a qualified weight master, under the direction of the fair.
15. Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animals gaining the lower prizes shall move into the next higher position, if in the opinion of the judges, the animals are worthy of such prizes.
16. Overfitting of cattle is discouraged. Any artificial means used to change the form or shape of an animal will disqualify it from competition.
17. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter in charge of the owner or employee. The fair will have stand-by attendants available during the youth judging or showing, men designated if there is trouble with the animals.
18. Joint ownership is considered to be as one owner in accordance with registration papers.

Open Dairy General Rules

1. ABSOLUTELY NO TREATED COWS ARE TO BE MILKED THROUGH THE PARLOR

- a. It's your responsibility to make arrangements if you bring a treated cow to the fair
 - i. THERE IS NOT ENOUGH DILUTION TO BE THE SOLUTION FOR POLLUTION
- 2. NO milk is to be disposed of in any drain except the drain in the top, right hand corner of the wash rack.
- 3. Exhibitors will be expected to keep the space they occupy clean and neat, with animals and equipment displayed in an attractive manner. Exhibitors should cooperate with the show committee in every way that may serve to increase the education value of the show.
- 4. Once animals and equipment are unloaded, all vehicles must be moved to the parking lot. No parking between/beside barns. The road between the barns must remain open for emergency vehicles to access at all times.
- 5. Tents are only allowed for clipping your animals. Once all animals are clipped, the tents must be taken down.
- 6. Manure Removal - All manure and bedding must be put in the pit. NO garbage i.e. cans, strings, etc. are to be put in the manure to be spread. All bedding is to be moved to the pit area. Wheelbarrows are suggested. Bring your own or share.
- 7. NO wheelbarrows are allowed in the milk house
- 8. NO spraying paint onto the hooves of animals unless there is cardboard protecting the concrete
- 9. NO walking of animals outside of the designated area. All animals must be kept in the designated area between the show ring and milk house. Animals are prohibited from being near food vendors due to health code violations.
- 10. A motion was made and passed that radios are no longer allowed in the barns
- 11. The Troy Fair will furnish all ribbons. Exhibitors must furnish feed and bedding.

Health Rules and Regulations

All animals admitted to (show or fair) shall be identified by a unique and permanent ear tag, tattoo, brand or records of unique physical attributes. Animals known to be infected with or exposed to any contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease, and animals restricted by quarantine may not be assembled for show purposes.

All animals admitted to (show or fair) must comply with applicable state (7 PA Code) or federal (9 CFR) rules. All cloven-hoof animals, not subject to 7 PA. Code or 9 CFR, include members of the deer and camilid families, shall have been born in Pennsylvania or resided in Pennsylvania for at least six (6) months and shall be brucellosis and tuberculosis tested (negative) by an accredited veterinarian within 60 days of admission to the show.

Animals presented for exhibition will be subject to inspection by show officials and will be rejected if evidence of infectious, contagious, or parasitic disease is apparent or if health certification or identification documentation is not acceptable.

All show animals should be held in isolation for at least 30 days after return to the herd or origin.

Draft Horse Health Regulations

- 1. Equines Shall be required to have negative coggins papers dated within 12 months of the date of the horse show. Any horse under 6 months of age does not require papers
- 2. Proof of Rabies Vaccination is mandatory. Please bring a copy of rabies certificate
- 3. No Equines showing evidence of any contagious or infectious disease will be permitted entry to the fair.

Open Dairy Health Regulations

1. ALL CATTLE MUST HAVE AN OFFICIAL 15 Digit 840 ISO-COMPLIANT RFID EAR TAG
2. ONLY ORIGINAL COPY OF THE CVI and CATTLE REGISTRATION PAPERS WILL BE ACCEPTED
 - a. NO cell phone pictures or photocopies of registration papers and/or CVI will be permitted
 - b. Official duplicate breed registration papers will be accepted
3. Exhibitors must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Chart/CVI) for all animals issue within 30 days of the show
 - a. Currently there is a requirement that ALL LACTATING DAIRY BREED CATTLE have a 7 day avian influenza milk test to CROSS STATE LINES. If your dairy cattle are house out of state and are lactating, make sure you get the required testing done by your veterinarian prior to the fair.
4. No animal showing evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease shall be allowed entrance into the show. **A statement that animals are free of any infectious and contagious diseases should be written on the CVI.**
5. The base date for computing health rules will be the opening day of the show. Animals will not be admitted without the necessary health papers. Health certificates must be available, always, as additional inspections of Health Certificates may be made.
6. The Troy Fair will follow the recommendation of the pA Dept. of Ag. in that a current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older is RECOMMENDED but not required. *Please note that the Troy Fair Board reserves the right to change this recommendation to a requirement.
7. The Troy Fair Dairy Show will follow the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's livestock health requirements and recommendations for 2025 Pennsylvania Fairs. For more info: 2025 Animal Health Rules for the Fairs.pdf (pa.gov)

4-H/FFA Youth Shows Animal Health Regulations

1. ALL CATTLE:
 - a. 30 day CVI listing the correct RFID tag numbers of every animal attending
 - b. Every animal must have an "840" electronic RFID tag
 - c. *** Should a case of influenza A be diagnosed in PA, additional health requirements and testing will be put in place ***
2. SWINE:
 - a. 30 day CVI listing correct RFID tag number
 - b. An electronic "840" RFID tag
 - c. All swine will be inspected before unloading by a certified Swine Health Monitor. Once a hog enters the barn, they may only leave the premises to go to slaughter.
3. GOATS/SHEEP
 - a. 30 day CVI matching the animals ID tag or tattoo numbers
 - b. One of the following
 - i. A USDA issued scrapie tag (most common for market goats)
 - ii. A LEGIBLE tattoo matching breed registration certificate (most common for dairy goats)
4. RABBITS
 - a. Sign the VCPR statement during the entry process in Fairentry
 - b. Make sure your rabbit is free of signs of diseases
5. POULTRY
 - a. Certificate of blood testing completed by a Certified POultry Technician
 - b. Leg band ID on each bird

- c. Market Poultry do not need to be blood tested, please contact Fran Johnson for blood testing details
- 6. OTHER REMARKS:
 - a. Have the vet record 2 ID numbers on your CVI (4-H tag & RFID tag) in case one number gets transposed.
 - b. Schedule AHEAD of time with you vet and make sure you have proper ID lined up well in advance (scrapie & RFID tags)
 - c. Any animal not in compliance with the above requirements upon entering the fairgrounds will be sent home
 - d. All of the above rules are taken directly from the requirements published by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

Open Goat Shows Health Regulations

1. Pennsylvania sheep and goats must have a verification of a veterinary-client-patient relationship (see Chapter A.6). A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (Valid for 30 days after the date of issue) is preferred; alternatively, a VCPR Form can also be used, or at minimum, a signed attestation on the entry form, to fulfill the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Act.
2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious disease.
3. Individual official animal identification is required for all sheep and goats. Identification used for sheep and goats must be permanently affixed to the individual animal. Official ID includes any of the following:
 - a. A USDA ear tag with a US shield which includes scrapie program tags (animals bearing identification with blue colored scrapie program tags labelled "meat" with a US shield are not permitted to be exhibited in Pennsylvania). Please call the Department at 717-772-2852 if such a tag is encountered.
 - b. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database (Scrapie tattoo - flock ID in the right ear, state postal code and letters/numbers and individual animal ID in the left ear.
 - c. A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.
4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for sheep 3 months of age and older
5. Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in goats should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian.
6. For OUT OF STATE goats
 - a. A certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation into Pennsylvania.
 - b. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) statement: See Chapter A.5
 - c. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.
 - d. Tuberculosis testing (Goats only)
 - i. No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited- free by the USDA
 - ii. All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be tested negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).
 - iii. All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older have tested negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation. And the individual animals (all ages) to be imported

- have also tested negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).
- iv. No goat shall be imported into this Commonwealth if it has been exposed to tuberculosis test-positive animals or animals that have clinical signs consistent with tuberculosis.

Department 1- Open Draft Horse

Show Rules:

1. Only serviceably sound horses will be entitled to be judged.
2. Classes will be combined to result in the judging of mixed breeds.
3. Horses' ages shall be computed according to their actual age at the date of show.
4. Exhibitors are expected to be ready to enter the ring at the final call for their class; to follow the lead of the ring steward; and to refrain from conversation with the judge unless answering questions or making acknowledgments.
5. There will be an open division, Jr Division 12 & under, and Sr Division is 13-18 years old.
6. Entry Fee for classes is \$5.00 per class.
7. Stalls are reserved first come first serve unless the department chairs are notified ahead of time of requested reservations. PLEASE CLEAN STALLS AFTER USE. \$5 per stall.

Department 2- Open Dairy Cattle

Show Rules:

1. There must be 20 milk cows for the breed to have a Summer Junior 2 year old Class
2. Intermediate Champion will follow the completion of the Sr 3 year old class. There will only be an Intermediate Champion selection if there are 20 or more cows entered for that respective breed
3. All entries are to be entered through the online Fair Entry Program. Entries are due by July 1, 2025 - should you need assistance submitting entries please contact Hannah Watson at 570-529-1360
4. An Entry Fee of \$6 per head MUST accompany entries
5. LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR THE 2025 YEAR @ \$35/HEAD
6. Entries are limited to 12 animals per breed, per exhibitor or farm
 - a. Space is limited and this rule will be enforced
7. Group classes must be entered online when submitting entries. No Entry=no premium.
8. The exhibitor is defined as the owner listed on the registration paper. If there are multiple owners listed on the paper, that unique group of owners is classified as one unique exhibitor.
9. All animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name by their respective breed associations.
 - a. Red & White Holstein cattle must have a Red & white registration certificate or a Holstein registration certificate and be true red in color.
10. Registration papers and Certificates of Veterinary Inspections must be checked in before unloading cattle.
11. Troy Fair Youth Dairy Show Participants are eligible to show in the Troy Fair Open Dairy Shows provided they have proper breed registration papers. Only animals shown in the youth show may stay and be shown in the open shows.
12. Each entered animal may only show in one breed show and must be designated at the time of entry.
13. 20 animals from at least 3 exhibitor's herds will be required to qualify as a breed show.
14. Substitution Entries should be made by completing a substitution form and providing it to the cattle superintendent upon arrival.
 - a. Substitutions will be permitted on the following basis
 - i. Junior animal for a junior animal and senior animal for a senior animal.
 - ii. Colored breed animals for colored breed animals. Holstein and Red & White animals for Holstein and Red & White animals.
15. Cattle must be in the ring promptly when called. Failure to comply may disqualify the exhibitor from competition.
16. No exhibitor or his agent shall communicate with the judge while judging takes place, except to answer questions proposed by the judge. Any exhibitor interfering with the judge will forfeit any premiums to which they would otherwise be entitled.
17. No person will be allowed in the show ring while animals are being judged, except for the judge, superintendent, and necessary attendants.
18. Where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his discretion, award a prize of such grade as the animal deserves
19. Should any animal be disqualified, the animals gaining the lower prizes shall move into the next higher position at the discretion of the judge.
20. Overfitting of cattle will disqualify the animal for competition. (Exception: artificial switches and tails are acceptable). The PDCA Code of Ethics will be enforced.
21. The management reserves the right to withhold premiums awarded in any case in which it shall appear that the regulations have not been complied with. The decision of the judge is final.

22. Once the first cow has made a complete lap around the judge, the class will be closed, and no further entries may enter the ring
23. Exhibitors must wear white pants with a professional collared shirt any color of their choice.
24. Absolutely no farm advertising can be printed on the shirts
25. No cattle should be in the center isle of the barns while a show is in progress
26. On show day, animals being shown will have preference at the wash rack until show time.

No online entry is required. Exhibitors must list all eligible animals but the six animals with the highest placings will be the only animals that count toward the final point tabulation.
2. Premier Exhibitor: the award for each breed will be presented to the exhibitor credited with the most points and not to exceed six animals owned and exhibited in the open single classes. In the event of a tie, the seventh highest placing animal will be used as the tiebreaker.
 - a. In the case of multiple ownership, all points awarded for Premier Exhibitor will be credited to the individual, partnership, or syndicate who is exhibiting the animal.
 - i. For example, owner = person A + person B = Exhibitor A+B(Partnership/syndicate). Lease Animals will not count toward the Premier Exhibitor Award if the animal is exhibited in the name of the lessee.
3. Premier Breeder: the award for each breed will be presented to the breeder of animals credited with the most points on and not to exceed six animals in the open single classes. In the event of a tie, the seventh highest placing animal will be used as the tiebreaker.
4. Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor awards will be based on the following point system. Highest points received to be used for premier breeder and/or exhibitor award.

Department 17- Floral Exhibits

Show Rules:

1. The exhibitor must have grown all plants/flowers entered for competition. Plants must have been the property of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the time of exhibition. (EXCEPTION: Wildflower Arrangement)
2. The exhibitor is limited to one entry in each class or subclass to be judged. (e.g. Section 11; Class 54A; Rose, Tea). **Exception:** Exhibitors may enter more than one entry in classes labeled “other”, if the entries are of different cultivars, since each cultivar will be judged separately at the discretion of the judges. One stem for Large specimens, 3 stems for most classes.
3. Please enter in the class/subclass that is listed. Please look it up beforehand if you do not know it. Check under both botanical name and common name. If it is not listed, you may enter in the “other” class that is most appropriate. (e.g. “Specimen Flowers: Others” or “Flowering Container: Others”). Please write the specific name of the flower cultivar on the tag.
4. Any plant or flower manifestly unfit to show may be excluded by the management, and the management may at any time order the removal of an exhibit which is in bad condition or is infested with noxious insects or diseases. Preferably no leaves on specimens should be below the water line as it will lead to decay. All specimens should be conditioned for peak performance at the time of judging.
5. Maximum care will be taken of the plants, containers, and accessories until exhibitors can reclaim them but the Fair cannot be responsible for damage or loss. *Please do not use any valuable and/or favorite vases.*
6. Exhibitor is responsible for furnishing vases that are appropriately sized. (NO PAPER OR STYROFOAM CUPS, or containers prone to tipping). Please place a drainage plate under pots. With container-grown plants, the appropriateness of the container will be considered in judging. Hanging pots should contain plants whose growth overhangs the container.
7. NO artificial flowers permitted. Only Dish Gardens, Fairy Gardens, Terrariums, and Large Displays may include artificial and/or decorative items, however living plants must predominate.
8. **Every effort should be made to enter before the fair.** Tags will be printed and available to attach as soon as possible. Fair entries should be entered early and scratched if not shown, rather than delayed until the time of the show. You may enter on the day of Floral Show Judging IF computer personnel can accommodate you.

(Examples: Oxeye Daisy, Fleabane, Bergamot, Timothy, Milkweed, Rudbeckia, Ferns) Originality, composition will be considered, as well as conditioning of plant material.

SECTION 9: Arboreal (Woody Branches)

Entries should be a single (1) woody branch, not to exceed 24 inches in height, cut from a tree or shrub. Flowers, nuts, cones, berries may be present. No foliage below the water line. Wedging and/or ballast may be used.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BE USED BY FAIRS AT THEIR 2025 EVENT

Each county/local fair is encouraged to conduct a 37th Annual Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest at their 2025 event. Listed below are the criteria which we would like each fair to use in their contest. The certified first place winner from each fair will then have the opportunity to enter an apple pie in the BLUE RIBBON APPLE PIE CONTEST at the 2026 PENNSYLVANIA FARM SHOW.

RULES for local Fair and the PA Farm Show contests are as follows:

1. Open to any individual amateur baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may **NOT** have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2025.
3. The Apple Pie, including fillings and crust, must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must just be edible.
4. Recipe must include at least 60% apples in the filling. It does not need to be a "traditional" two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
6. The Pie entry and its recipes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
7. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 1/2" by 11" sheets of paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.
8. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
9. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Creativity is essential to a varied competition. Do not limit your contest to a "traditional" two-crust apple pie. We are looking for a variety of fillings in the pies; the pie must include at least 60% apples in the filling.

Each Fair must submit the Contest Summary Report verifying the winning apple pie baker. This person will then be eligible to enter the state competition at the 2026 PA Farm Show and will receive the Official PA Farm Show Certification Entry Form directly from the PA Fairs Special Baking Contest Committee.

NOTE: If an individual has already won 1st place at another fair in 2025 for this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest, that individual is now considered qualified through that Fair to compete at the 2026 PA Farm Show and is no longer eligible to enter this contest at any upcoming Fairs.

2025 HOMEMADE CHOCOLATE CAKE CONTEST

1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may **NOT** have won 1st place in this Homemade Chocolate Cake contest at any other fair in 2025.
3. The Cake and any Fillings and Frostings must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.). Any decorations must just be edible.
4. Cake recipe **must feature chocolate or cocoa** as a main ingredient.
5. Entry must be a **layered chocolate cake**. The finished overall size of the cake, including decorations, shall not exceed 12" high by 12" wide by 12" deep.
6. Entry **must be frosted** and frosting must also be made from "scratch" (no pre-packaged frosting).
7. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging **on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
8. The Cake entry and its recipes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
9. Recipes must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.
10. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

4. The recipe shall include eggs that were produced in Pennsylvania, if possible.
5. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging **on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
6. The Cake entry and its recipes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will **not** be returned.
7. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (*printed on one-side of 8-1/2" x 11" size sheets of paper*). Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all the pages.
8. Refrigeration is NOT available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
9. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

2025 PA Preferred® Junior Baking Contest Cookies, Brownies and Bars

The goal of the PA Preferred® Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania's agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

RULES:

1. Open to any individual amateur baker (ages 8 through 18 at the time of the fair's contest) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred® Junior Baking contest at any other fair in 2025.
3. Entry must be six (6) individual sized portions of the baked entry item (cookies, brownies or bars).
4. The Cookies, Brownies or Bars, and any fillings and frostings, must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.). Any decorations must just be edible.
5. At least two (2) PA Preferred® or locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (such as oats or flour), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. A PA Preferred® logo is not required because not all PA Preferred® products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient (see attached example). Contact RA-AGPAPreferred@pa.gov for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
8. The PA Preferred® entry and its recipes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
9. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. The name of each PA Preferred® ingredient or locally produced ingredient must be clearly listed along with the name of the source that made/grew the product (ex: PA Preferred Milk – Galliker's brand; or Apples - Smith Farm Orchard). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.
10. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
